Hundred is "opanwinge," so when the amount is in the hundreds, you will use the following form. If it is three hundred dollars, it will be written as : the hundred first, this is the basic factor, and then the amount of hundreds and the bill.

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| opawinge yamni owapi | hundred three bills, or three hundred dollars |
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When writing the tens up to a hundred, the basic factor is "wikcemna."
